

What is a Hedgehog Highway?

A Hedgehog Highway is a 5-inch gap in a fence or wall allowing access for Hedgehogs. Other names include 'Hedgehog Door', 'Hedgehog Hole' and 'Hedgehog Tunnel'. These gaps are essential in the battle to prevent the extinction of our endangered spiky friends.

The Hedgehog Highway allows hedgehogs to:

- * Forage for food
- * Meet mates to breed
- * Access nesting sites

Helping Conservation One Hedgehog At A Time

If you would like to encourage Hedgehogs into your garden and help protect this endangered species, Colwall Parish Council has a limited number of Hedgehog Highways surrounds for you to install in your gardens on a first come first served basis.
